OUR SCHOOL

Jones Memorial Primary is a controlled co- educational Primary School situated in Enniskillen and was established in 1907. It is comprised of ten classrooms two of which are Specialist Provision plus an ICT Suite & Library.

The school building and grounds have been extensively refurbished and upgraded giving us bright and modern facilities fully fit for us to provide an EDUCATION for your child.

A new traffic system at the front of school allows parents and carers to leave and collect children safely to and from school.

There are two Learning Support Rooms (ASD & LSC) which are used for pupils with additional learning needs and those on the Autistic Spectrum. The school has separate changing facilities to cater for children with additional needs.

Pupils enjoy extensive grounds and benefit from two large playgrounds and a grass area which includes an outdoor Play-trial, gym and a grass football pitch. The site includes a sheltered garden area which is tended to by the classes.

The school has an Assembly Hall / Dining Hall where children can enjoy a healthy breakfast, break and lunch in pleasant surroundings.

We are proud of the successes of many of our former pupils. We value the trust and loyalty of our past pupils many of whom are now parents of our current pupils.

We also enjoy close relationships with the local business community, churches and other local schools. The school has a well-deserved reputation for providing a happy and caring environment which stimulates children to achieve their potential.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Religious Education

Religious Education (RE) is provided in accordance with the Core Syllabus. We are a controlled school and have a strong commitment to expressing Christian principles and values in the life of school and remain open to all children. We have RE and Circle Time in our classrooms and all children attend class led assemblies each week as a collective act of worship and reflection. Parents are invited to attend class Assemblies throughout the year. As an **inclusive school** we also provide instruction in **Holy Communion and Confirmation**.



Music & Drama

We have a proud and rich tradition of excellence in the areas of Music & Drama. Our school choir performs at a number of events. Our pupils also benefit from expert musical tuition and have the opportunity to learn to play various instruments including string and woodwind. Pupils have opportunities to take part in various Drama productions which range from whole class Assemblies to polished professional productions including amongst others, 'Bah Humbug', 'It's Christmas' and 'Cinderella Rockerfella'.

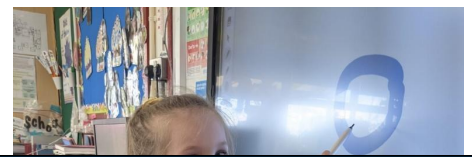
ICT / Online learning

ICT is embedded into classroom learning and teaching. All classrooms are equipped with recently installed active panels and iPads. Our well stocked and modern ICT Suite allows for the creative teaching of ICT. We have successfully become a Digital Leader School.

The school avails of online learning from: Mathletics, Accelerated Reader, Bug Club and Reading Eggs. Each child uses either Seesaw/Google classroom /Teams to allow teachers and pupils to record and share what is happening in the classroom. It helps pupils learn how to use technology, be creative and stay connected.

Assessment

The assessment of children's progress is an integral part of the learning and teaching process. It will contribute to a holistic view of the child – that is, the child's personal, social, physical and intellectual achievements. The outcomes inform parents & teachers about a pupils progress and enable diagnosis of individual development needs and the identification of appropriate learning targets. Parents obtain information about their child through year group meetings, annual reports, parent teacher meetings



SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

If your child does not make progress we will want to find out why. By closely monitoring progress especially in literacy and numeracy, we hope to identify children having difficulties as soon as possible. A range of provision is made for children who may have learning and/or physical difficulties. The class teacher will cater for the individual needs of each child, supported by the school's Learning Support Coordinator, relevant outside agencies and classroom assistants where appropriate. We have several successful early intervention programmes in operation, catering for a range of needs.

PASTROAL CARE

As a school committed to offering excellence in pastoral care to all pupils JMPS offers support for those children in need. Primary aged children are in early stages of their personal, emotional, social and educational development. As such they deserve the highest standards of pastoral care and support to assist them to develop their full potential. Every member of staff is committed to looking after the pastoral needs of the children in JMPS. We recognise that children cannot work to their potential if they have anxieties or worries, and we welcome information from parents and the children when problems at home or school may be causing distress or anxiety. 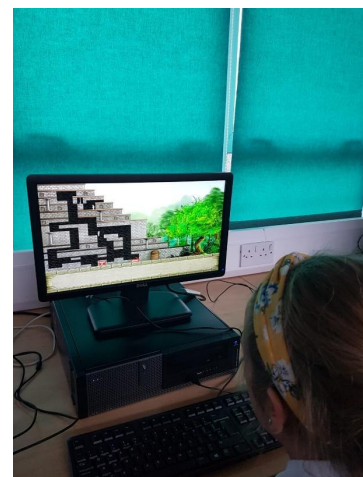

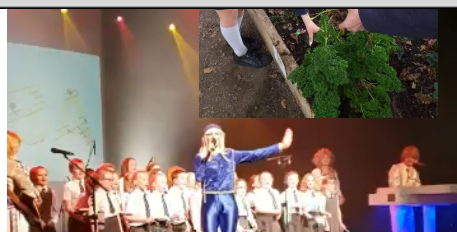


CHILD PROTECTION & SAFEGUARDING PROCEDURES

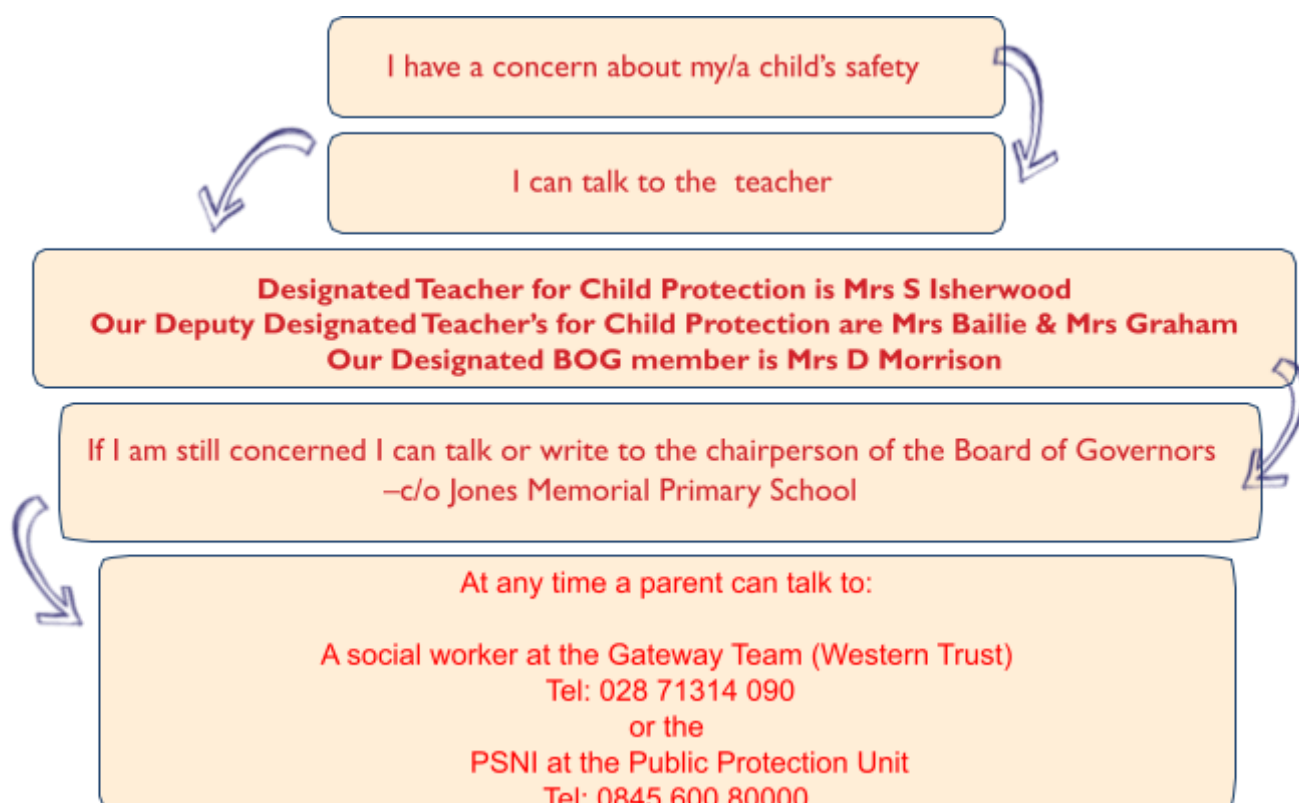
The welfare and protection of children is of critical importance in our school. A large amount of time and effort goes into ensuring that every child in JMPS is safe and happy. Jones Memorial Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share in this commitment. Staff work hard to maintain an environment where children feel safe and secure.

Our comprehensive Safeguarding Policy is reviewed annually and is readily available from the school office or on our website. The curriculum is designed to ensure opportunities for children to develop the skills they need to recognise and stay safe from abuse. Children know they can approach any adult in school if they are worried and they will receive a consistent, supportive response.

We actively promote Safeguarding messages to our pupils and families.

Reception

Our Reception Class is situated in the school building and is considered an integral part of our school. The room itself is spacious, bright and furnished with a wide range of equipment to provide a happy and stimulating environment in which your child may gain independence, develop initiative, make decisions and solve problems.

frame and garden area. There are 26 places in our Reception class for pupils aged 4 and over (the age of admission is determined by the Department of Education).

The class is staffed by one teacher and one classroom assistant. These adults support your child during carefully planned play to enhance their skills, encourage thinking and extend their learning. We greatly value the interest and involvement of parents and encourage you to build firm relationships to foster a positive Pre-school experience for all. To provide a quality educational experience for children in the Reception Class we adhere to the Pre-School Curriculum as set out by the Department of Education.

The six areas of development established in the Pre-School Curriculum are further built upon within Primary One and Two.

Eco-Committee

CHARGES & REMISSIONS POLICY



We provide a free education for all pupils at Jones Memorial Primary School under the Education Reform Order 1989. There are just a few exceptions and these are detailed below:

- All board, lodging and travel costs on residential trips (except where statutory remissions apply)
- Cost associated with optional extras. For example, visits to the theatre or extra-curricular activities
- Materials or ingredients used in practical subjects where parents have indicated that they wish to receive the finished product
- Tuition in a musical instrument/swimming instruction

The school will, as it has done in the past, appeal to parents from time to time for voluntary donations but it is stressed that no child will be disadvantaged in any way if

Physical Education

The school's PE policy sets out aims which are designed to

- Encourage a positive attitude to sport
- Provide opportunities for participation to every child
- Improve physical skills

- Provide new experiences and set new challenges

The children participate in many tournaments and competitions throughout the year. Each class has at least two sessions of physical education per week. Pupils from P3-6 receive football coaching from either the IFA coach or council provision. P5-7 are given swimming lessons at different times during the school year. The school is very fortunate to have a large school playing field, two hard core pitches and a multipurpose hall for indoor sporting activities.

As a Gold Ambassador school for Sustrans we encourage the 'Daily Mile, walking bus and cycling proficiency'

Wrap-Around Care....

We appreciate that many parents have to juggle child care and work. In Jones Memorial PS we try to support parents as much as possible by providing supervised clubs from 8.15am – 5pm. Sessions are very affordable and can be booked on an adhoc basis, allowing parents a degree of flexibility especially if they have early work commitments.

- **Breakfast club**
 - o Children are supervised and there are light options to choose for breakfast
- **Buttercup Club (Rec – P1) 1.40 -3.15pm**
 - o Children are supervised by a Classroom Assistant
- **After school Homework Club**
 - o This is available Mon to Thurs from 3-5pm. The club is run by Classroom Assistants. Pupils engage in a variety of activities indoor/outdoor, iPads board games etc. There is the opportunity to complete homework and receive a light snack is also available. This is a place for pupils of all ages to mix together as well as providing a convenient after school care in a familiar setting.

To achieve this, we invite you to the school so that you can tell us more about your child and we can explain our admissions and other arrangements.

We adopt a healthy eating policy in relation to mid-morning snack, and children are encouraged to drink water during the day. Pupils play outside during break where possible.

P6/7 pupils are given the responsibility of Playground Pals and their role is to help develop play in early years.

Parents can choose whether they would like their child to have a packed lunch or school dinner.

School Meals are cooked on site and parents receive a menu in advance.

Families in receipt of Income Support/Job seekers allowance and/or tax credit may be entitled to free school meals.
