PHA GUIDANCE AND UPDATES

I wrote to all families at the beginning of last week to keep you informed of the recent updates with Track and Tracing from PHA. As you are aware the PHA are now responsible for conducting Track and Tracing where a positive case is identified in a school setting.

WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19?

If your child tests positive for COVID-19, they should self-isolate for 10 days and not attend school during this time. The Public Health Agency Contact Tracing Service (PHA CTS) will be in touch to determine who your child's close contacts are, and will ask for contact details for them so they can be advised appropriately. If your child tests positive for COVID-19, you should inform the school, who may issue **Warn & Inform** letters to the class.

WHAT IF MY CHILD TESTS NEGATIVE FOR COVID-19? If your child tests negative for COVID-19 they can return to school as normal, provided they feel well enough to do so.

WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD'S FRIEND TESTS POSITIVE? If you do not hear from the PHA CTS, then there is no requirement for you or your child to self-isolate. The PHA CTS will identify all close contacts, and follow them up directly. If your child has been identified as a close contact, then the PHA CTS will make contact with you or your child and provide advice. However, if your child develops symptoms, then they must self-isolate and not attend school, until they have had a negative test.

FLU IMMUNISATION PROGRAMME

The Flu Vaccination programme in schools will be going ahead this year in the Autumn Term. The date initially set by the community nurse to administer this in JMPS is **Wednesday 3rd November.**

Consent forms will be sent home to you with children in the coming weeks. You MUST complete the consent form for the vaccine to be administered.

The programme has been introduced to give protection to children against flu, which can be a very unpleasant illness and can mean that they have to take time off school. It will also help to stop the spread of flu and so will protect people around them as well. The vaccine is usually given to children by a simple spray into their nose and they can return to their lessons very quickly afterwards.

WEARING FACE COVERINGS ON SCHOOL PREMISES

Thank you to those parents and guests to school who so diligently wear a face mask or covering while on school grounds. This is an important risk mitigation measure to help prevent the spread of the virus in school premises. While I understand some adults may be exempt on medical grounds, we ask that all guests to school wear a face covering — even when outside.

PASTORAL CARE

Thank you to our parents and carers who have completed the pastoral care pack for children. Any changes to collection arrangements must be shared with us in writing. Please be aware that we CAN NOT release pupils into the care of juniors aged 16 or below. As you know, we have worked hard to establish a safe routine for the dismissal of children at the end of the school day. We ask that you remind your child each day what their arrangements are for home time. If an adult is collecting them, please tell them who it will be.

SCHOOL CARPARK

Parents and visitors to school are welcome to use the Carpark facilities in our grounds. However, it is up to all adults to ensure the safety and care of our pupils and is paramount. For this reason, we ask everyone to adhere to the following:

- Speed limit of 5 MPH (should be strictly adhered to)
- Vehicles should not be parked on pavements or access points at any time.
- All drivers must observe the one-way system.
- Please do not park across the zebra crossings.
- There is a designated area for STAFF CARS only.
- Drivers must exercise caution at all times when in school grounds.

- Pedestrians should use the designated crossing areas & pathways.
- Parents should get out of their car to collect their child and escort them to their vehicle or in to school (pupil safety comes first).
- The disabled bays at the front of school should only be used by blue badge holders Please show consideration for other drivers and remember the safety of our pupils is paramount

Please share this information with everyone at home who may be collecting or leaving pupils to school that they must show concern to other vehicles parked at the school.

BIKE TO SCHOOL WEEK

Jones Memorial Primary School is taking part in Bike to school week which will run from the **MONDAY 27TH SEPTEMBER TO FRIDAY 1ST OCTOBER.** We are encouraging pupils during this week to safely cycle or scoot to school.

Bike to school week is a week-long event designed to showcase the benefits of cycling and scooting to school across the UK. If you cycle or scoot to school this week, we would love you to share pictures with us via School Social Media or Seesaw. This is the first initiative of the year that we are completing in connection with Sustrans. Jones Memorial Primary is an Active Travel School, and we are working towards gaining our next level of accreditation.

HEALTHY BREAK & SNACKS IN SCHOOL

In JMPS, we try to encourage a policy of healthy eating. We would ask that all pupils who take lunch have a lunch box with their names clearly visible. Fizzy drinks, chocolate, sweets and crisps are not advised as we try to promote a healthy balanced diet for all.

As we have children who suffer from specific and severe food allergies, we request that no peanuts, seeds or related products are brought to school. The school is a "NUT FREE ZONE".

School dinners will continue to be available to all children. We ask that dinner money is sent into school in a sealed, marked envelope with the correct amount included as no change will be given. The cost is £2.60 per day.

Help your child get their five a day by including some fruit or vegetables as a snack for their morning break.

This includes all fresh fruit and vegetables and pots or tins of fruit in fruit juice, but not in syrup.

A portion could be:

- 1 medium sized piece of fruit, e.g. apple, orange, banana, pear
- 2 small fruits, e.g. kiwi fruits, satsumas, plums
- 1 cup of grapes, cherries or berries
- 1 large slice of pineapple or melon
- 1 cereal bowl of salad, e.g. lettuce, tomatoes, cucumber and celery
- 3 heaped tablespoons of fresh veg, e.g. chopped or sliced carrots, peppers or sugar-snap peas
- 3 heaped tablespoons of fruit salad (fresh or tinned in fruit juice)
