REMINDERS

- Our daily snack service has resumed from Reception, P1-3 at a cost of 50p per day payable at £12 for the month of September and £12 for October. Daily Snack includes: A small piece of fruit and a bread based snack (eg, Pancake, Toast, Bagel etc) delivered to your child's class
- School doors open at 8:15am for Breakfast Club and will close at 9.20am sharp.
- Pick up for walking children is outside P5 beside the Polytunnel.
- ONLY SEN / EA taxis are allowed in staff carpark.
- School lunches available every day at £2.60, £13 per 5 day week.
- Healthy Breaks required with 50p for treat Friday
- Brass Tuition on a Monday
- Strings Tuition on a Tuesday
- PE kit only to be worn on the PE day for each class.

BREAKFAST CLUB

MORNING ROUTINES

Last year, due to restrictions, we had in place staggered arrival times. This arrangement is now no longer necessary. We have instead introduced a soft opening approach — this is mainly to help reduce traffic congestion in the carpark and the narrow gate beside the bus lane. Children may arrive in to school between 8.45-9.10am, 8.15am for Breakfast Club. Punctuality is important to our class routines. However, if you are late to arrive to school i.e. after 9.20am, please bring your child to the school office where they can make their way to their classroom.

HOME TIME ROUTINES

As per arrival times, we no longer have staggered home times. Instead classes go home at the following times: Rec & P1 can go home at 12.55pm if not staying for school dinner and at 1.15pm if not staying for Buttercup Club. We do, however, expect that drivers are responsible for their parking and the safety of others while in school premises when all pupils leave at 3:15pm.

School Attendance HIGH IMPORTANCE

It is very important that our pupils attend school every day. Each day absent from school represents a day of lost learning. We understand that occasionally a child may be ill and not able to attend school – this should be rare.

Each month we closely monitor the attendance of all children. If attendance falls below 85% we will draw your attention to this matter. If your child is off school, please ring and leave a message to explain the absence and follow this up with a written explanation on the child's return to school.

HOW TO RAISE A CONCERN...

At Jones Memorial Primary School, we value parents and carers as partners in the education of our pupils. The views of parents are significant and we encourage the positive contributions which parents and carers make to the life of our school.

We recognise that from time to time, a parent or carer may have a concern about some aspect of their child's life at school. By working in partnership with home, it is our aim that any concern is dealt with quickly and efficiently.

PLEASE FIND BELOW THE PROCEDURE WE HAVE IN PLACE.

It is important that we have a staged approach to raising and addressing concerns as this means issues will be heard by more than one person in a fair and unbiased way.

IF YOU HAVE A CONCERN ABOUT ANY ASPECT OF CHILD PROTECTION OR SAFEGUARDING DO NOT HESITATE TO CONTACT EITHER: MRS ISHERWOOD (Designated Teacher for Child Protection) or MRS BAILIE OR MRS GRAHAM (Deputy Designated Teacher's for Child Protection).

HOW DO I RAISE A CONCERN?

- 1. Make an appointment with the class teacher to discuss the matter. All parents/carers from home must make appointments to speak with the teacher. (Making an appointment will enable the teacher to give you the necessary time to listen attentively to your concern. Teachers are not able to ring parents during class time). MOST OFTEN CONCERNS ARE RESOLVED AT THIS STAGE.
- 2. If after speaking to the teacher the matter is not resolved the issue can be taken up with the Head of Key Stage (Mrs Bailie/Mrs Graham).
- 3. Following the second stage, you may make an appointment with the VP, Mrs Bailie.

- 4. If concerns still remain the issue can be referred to the Principal, Mrs Isherwood.
- 5. Ultimately, if the issue is still not resolved the parents/carers can write to the Chairperson of the of Board of Governors (Mrs A Beattie)- please refer to our Complaints Procedure.

IT IS VERY RARE FOR CONCERNS NOT TO BE RESOLVED BEFORE STAGE 4.

ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

All parents whose children have a Medical or Dietary Care Plan last year, it is important that you, as parents, ensure we have the most up-to-date Care Plan. If the Care Plan has been reviewed by a medical practitioner, you must give us the most recent copy. If over the previous few months your child has received a Medical or Dietary Care Plan it is imperative, you inform us and give us a copy of the Care Plan.

Parents of new Reception or P1 pupils should also ensure we have received a copy of Care Plans if appropriate.

If a child has to take medication in school their parent or guardian MUST complete a school Administration of Medication Form OR A Request for a Pupil to Carry His/Her Medication.

Medication will NOT be administered unless the appropriate form is completed and received by school.

For safety reasons, children should NOT bring their own medication to school – this should be brought by an adult and left in the office. Please remember, if your child requires an inhaler (or any other type of medication) it is your responsibility to ensure there is an adequate supply in school and the medication is in date. Please remember, school staff can only administer medication in accordance to prescribed instructions or instructions from a GP or Care Plan.

ALLERGIES & INTOLERANCES

Thank you to those parents who have already updated us about allergies or intolerances for their child. If your child has an allergy or intolerance we do not know about, please email school to let us know-further supporting documentation i.e. medical diagnosis will also be required. Similarly, if the allergy or intolerance is no longer a medical issue, please keep us informed.

RECEPTION & PRIMARY 1 SETTLING IN ARRANGEMENTS

It is with lots of joy that we welcome all our new pupils to JMPS- we hope our youngest pupils have enjoyed their first few days of Primary School. Establishing good routines in school is so important to give everyone a sense of security and belonging – many thanks to our Reception & P1 parents for helping to make the start of the day and home times smooth and safe for everyone.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Last year, some families were entitled to Free School Meals. As you know, parents/carers must apply for this provision annually. I wrote to all parents in June with information on how to apply along with sources of help from the EA if required. As FSM entitlement is reviewed annually, we are unable to provide a free meal from 1st September unless informed by the Education Authority that you are entitled to this provision (even if you were in receipt of school meals last year). Unless we have confirmation of FSM for 2022-23 academic year from EA there will be a charge for school meals.


